POLICY AND PROCEDURE

- 1. NUMBER: 1.1.3
- 2. SUBJECT: Prevailing Directives
- 3. POLICY: It shall be the policy of the Board of Commissioners to maintain certain regular directives for the control, discipline and effective operation of the

Fire District.

4. SCOPE: This Policy and Procedure is applicable to all personnel of Grant County

Fire District 3.

5. RESPONSIBILITIES:

A. All personnel are responsible to follow these directives.

6. PROCEDURE:

A. Personnel Shall:

- 1. Be held responsible for the safekeeping and care of all personal issued District property.
- 2. Notify District Fire Chief or designee of any extended inability to report for duty.
- 3. Notify the Administrative Assistant within five (5) working days of any change of address or telephone number.
- 4. Be courteous and respectful at all times.
- 5. Immediately report <u>any</u> accident, or injury sustained while performing for the District.
- 6. Perform every duty required by order or directive, instruction or command in a prompt and implicit manner.
- 7. Promptly report the loss or finding of any District materials or equipment.
- 8. Exercise precautionary measures to avoid injury to self or others when engaged in any Fire District activity.
- 9. Obedience, respect and courtesy to those designated to perform the duties of a higher rank.
- 10. In matters of general conduct not within the scope of District directives, be governed by the ordinary rules of good behavior observed by law abiding and self-respecting citizens, and commit no act or omission tending to bring reproach or poor reflection upon the District.
- 11. Be held responsible for any disorderly, disgraceful or unlawful conduct.
- 12. Remember at all times, he/she is a public servant, and commit no act or

- omission which would constitute a breach of public trust.
- 13. Read and become familiar with these directives.
- 14. Deposit all valuables found or received at an emergency scene with the Incident Commander.
- 15. If suspended or relieved from duty, promptly surrender all District property.
- 16. Be held responsible for the operation of District vehicles for official use only.
- 17. Treat visiting officials from other communities with the respect due their position.
- 18. In the transaction of District business, operate through their immediate superior officer, unless otherwise ordered.
- 19. Practice economy in the use of supplies and metered services and see that waste is avoided. Personnel shall not utilize District owned expendable items for personal gain.
- 20. All civilian or non-affiliated personnel shall always be supervised by District personnel when they are on District property.
- 21. Criticism should be in a constructive manner and based on fact.

B. Personnel Shall Not:

- 1. Neglect to thoroughly familiarize himself/herself with these directives and any amendments thereto.
- 2. Make a false statement or report with intent to deceive.
- 3. Commit any act for which he/she may be arrested or imprisoned.
- 4. Possess or consume any intoxicating liquors or unlawful drugs on District property.
- 5. Absent himself/herself from any post without permission.
- 6. Lend, sell or give away any District property without proper authorization.
- 7. Alter or change any District building, appliance, vehicle, equipment or fixture without proper authorization.
- 8. Furnish persons not connected with the District with any information relative to any incident, except as authorized.
- 9. Trade or substitute any personal issued equipment with another without the permission of the District Fire Chief or designee.
- 10. Require any personal favor or service from other personnel of the District.
- 11. Willfully damage or abuse District property.
- 12. Give expression to indecent, profane or uncivil language while performing for the District.
- 13. Handle carelessly or recklessly any District vehicle.
- 14. Place any property on apparatus that will detrimentally affect its use or finish
- 15. Change or alter the arrangement of firefighting equipment on apparatus or elsewhere or otherwise disarrange the prevailing system, unless approved by the District Fire Chief or designee.
- 16. Be guilty of immoral or improper conduct.

- 17. Accept any reward, gift or donation.
- 18. Smoke while driving or operating any District vehicle.
- 19. Receive or present any award for any kind of services rendered in the discharge of their duty, without the permission of the District Fire Chief or designee.
- 20. Permit persons not affiliated with Grant County Fire District 3 to ride on the apparatus or use any equipment belonging to the District without the permission of the District Fire Chief or designee.
- 21. Allow children to remain unattended in any District facility for any reason.
- 22. Rely upon rumors or repeat adverse propaganda.
