## POLICY AND PROCEDURE

## TACTICAL ACTION GUIDELINES

- 1. NUMBER: 9.1.6
- 2. SUBJECT: Use of Ladders
- 3. POLICY: When using ladders, all personnel shall follow appropriate safety and operational procedures as detailed in this Policy and Procedure and District training procedures.
- 4. SCOPE: This Policy and Procedure is applicable to all personnel of Grant County Fire District 3.
- 5. **RESPONSIBILITIES**:
  - A. It shall be the responsibility of the District Fire Chief or designee to enforce this Policy and Procedure.

## 6. **PROCEDURE**:

- A. Ladders not designed and built for the fire service should not be used, including ladders found on the fireground.
- B. Sufficient personnel should be used when carrying ground ladders. Whenever possible, position a firefighter at the front of the ladder being carried to safeguard against hitting people or objects.
- C. Do not use excessive speed in carrying or raising ladders; be especially careful when the ground is slippery.
- D. Do not place the ladder on the ground where it may be damaged by moving apparatus, subject to engine exhaust heat or become a tripping hazard.

- E. Personnel shall adhere to the following principals when working with ground ladders:
  - 1. To achieve the proper angle, the butt of the ladder should be 1/4 of the total used length of the ladder from the building.
  - 2. The area should be checked for overhead obstructions (wires, signs, tree limbs, etc.) and falling debris prior to and during the ladder raise.
  - 3. The ladder butt should be on secure and level ground.
  - 4. The ladder should never be placed so it is straddling a hose line.
  - 5. The first firefighter up a ladder should check the dogs to ensure they are in place.
  - 6. The tip (or top) should be placed to give adequate and secure support. If possible, the tip should be tied, and a firefighter should be positioned at the base of the ladder to secure it.
  - 7. Keep hands and feet off the rungs when the fly is being raised or lowered.
